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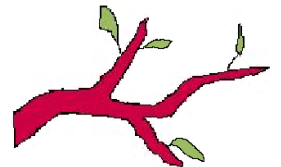
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# The Value of Privacy

# Our Current Privacy Laws

## Privacy Act – Fair Information Practices

\**Collection limitation* – limited, lawful and consensual

\**Data quality* – accurate, relevant and complete

\**Purpose specification* – data not repurposed

\**Use limitation* -- disclosed only for purpose collected

\**Security safeguards* – protected against loss or theft

\**Openness* – transparency to the public

\**Individual participation* -- access to own data and chance to correct

\**Accountability* – data holder must be accountable

## E-Government Act

\*System of Record Notice (SORN) -- Analysis of how personally identifiable information is collected, stored, protected, shared, and managed.

\*No distinction between U.S. and non-U.S. nationals.

\*Required for all Major Information System before the systems will be funded
