#### Problem Statement

Residential associations in Arlington County have a wide range of capacity for using digital infrastructure. Currently, some residential associations do not have access to current digital infrastructure. As a result, these associations are thus less able to engage members digitally to organize and are often adversely affected in the county decision making processes. Some residential civic associations have extensive technology and other forms of infrastructure, which gives them an organized voice in county civic engagement processes. The Civic Federation seeks to address this digital divide through this research project.



### Project Objectives

- Identify what technology and other infrastructure is necessary for residential civic associations need to thrive and participate more fully in county civic processes.
- 2. Identify best practices residential civic associations can employ to establish or modernize their technology and other infrastructure.
- Develop a framework for the Civic Federation to provide or otherwise host technology infrastructure for residential civic associations in need of direct support.
