## County Board Action on Noise Control Code Revisions

On Tuesday March 18th, the County Board voted unanimously to defer advertising staff's revised Noise Control Code. Board members indicated that more time was needed to tweak the language of a new provision related to noise from groups of four or more people. A somewhat-revised version will be on the County Board's April meeting agenda for advertisement, with a final vote in May.

## Housing Committee Recommendations on Housing Funding in FY '15 Budget

The Civic Federation has long supported funding for affordable housing in the County budget. Several Federation members have served on housing task forces and commissions over the years. The County Manager's proposed FY '15 budget states:

*...Arlington continues to experience losses in its market rate affordable housing units, due to redevelopment and increased rents.*

Arlington County dedicates about 5% of its budget to support various housing programs. The ACCF Housing Committee focuses its recommendations of support for level funding in the Affordable Housing Investment Fund (AHIF), Housing Grants,

Permanent Supportive Housing, and the allocation for the Comprehensive Homeless Services Center.

1) The Arlington County Civic Federation Housing Committee applauds the County Manager for including \$9.66 million in her base budget for the **Affordable Housing Investment Fund (AHIF)** and her recommendation to earmark \$2.8 million from projected one-time additional funds to make the FY '15 AHIF funds level with FY '14.

2) We also applaud the County Manager for budgeting \$7.9 million for **Housing Grants** and for increasing the "ongoing" portion of this amount to \$7.4 million. The committee notes that the increase in demand for Housing Grants has lessened and is fairly level.

3) The Committee commends the County Manager for funding **Permanent Supportive Housing** at the level (\$2.064 million) to support current and expected clients. Here we note the high success rate in having households in the program stay in their dwelling units.

4) We commend the Manager's FY'15 \$1.731 million allocation as a strong commitment to the **Comprehensive Homeless Services Center** which will result in comprehensive and efficient delivery of services to our most vulnerable population. We look forward to the opening of the Center in February 2015.

## **Proposed Resolution to Cut the Real Estate Tax Rate**

### **Arlington County Civic Federation**

**March 20, 2014**

Whereas in November 2013, the Arlington County Manager anticipated a budget deficit of \$20 million to \$25 million;

Whereas the Arlington County Manager subsequently noted that increases in real estate assessments means the anticipated deficit “no longer exists;”

Whereas the Arlington County Board advertised no increase in the CY 2014 real estate tax rate for FY 2015;

Whereas maintaining the current tax rate would result in an increase in the overall tax and fee burden for the average household of 5.3%;

Whereas the most recent annual inflation rate was 1.58%.

Whereas total residential taxes and fees for the average Arlington household increased by 15.2% from CY 2010 to 2014;

Whereas the inflation rate from January 2010 to January 2014 was just 7.24%;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Civic Federation recommends that the Arlington County Board adopt a real estate tax rate decrease of no less than \$0.03 (3-cents).
