



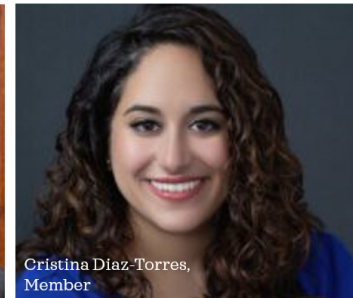

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Learning Models for 2021-22

PreK-12 In-Person Learning (five days in-person instruction per week)

- ✓ 5 days of in-person instruction per week, Monday-Friday
- ✓ Normal bell schedules and start/end times; all classes in person with teachers present
- ✓ In-person specials and electives, shared materials, open library checkout
- ✓ Normal bus capacity, no temperature checks or health screening
- ✓ Normal breakfast and lunch period
- ✓ Extended Day offered, normal enrollment and operation
- ✓ All COVID-19 mitigation strategies (distancing, cleaning, screening, mask requirement, etc.) will be followed in school per VDH and CDC guidance.

K-12 Distance Learning Program (program is separate from school of record)

- ✓ 5 days of synchronous, teacher-led instruction, with time for asynchronous learning
- ✓ Schedules, curriculum and pacing aligned with traditional school
- ✓ Separate program with a dedicated administrator and staff focused on high-quality distance learning
- ✓ Students maintain connection to their school of record through their counselor, and extracurricular activities and sports
- ✓ Workspace may be provided for students who need additional support
- ✓ Meal services will depend on guidance from the USDA/VDOE; Extended Day and Pre-K not offered

Overarching Goals

Focus on an **Excellent Education** Regardless of the Delivery Model.
Support Staff to be Innovative and **Deliver High Quality Virtual and In-person Instruction.**

Student Success and Well-Being

- Provide **technology and WIFI connectivity** for every PreK-12 student
- Implement new **safety procedures** with a focus on safely resuming in-person learning
- Ensure **every student is connected to a trusted adult** to support academic and personal growth
- Implement and support social-emotional, mental health, and physical **wellness practices for staff and students**

Operational Planning

- Review and **adopt policies** to include **Equity, Facilities, and Discipline**
- Review the **APS relationship with the School Resource Officers** with stakeholder engagement
- Adjust FY 2021 budget as needed and adopt a needs-based FY 2022 **budget**
- Adopt an Interim FY 2022 Four-to-Six-Year **Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)**
- Refine the **PreK-12 Instructional Program Pathways (IPP)**
- ✓ Adopt new **elementary school boundaries** for SY 2021-22
- **Name/Rename schools** as needed



FY 2022 Budget Highlights

- Revised enrollment projections provided by staff that reduces enrollment by 525 students.
- A staff compensation option that includes a 2% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) at the start of the year and a STEP increase midway through the year. It also includes an additional STEP at the top of the pay scale midway through the year for certain salary scales.
- A class size increase of one student in grades K-5.
- Additional amendments to restore \$85,000 for copiers and added \$8,538 to implement a \$10 per visual arts student planning factor at the middle school level.
