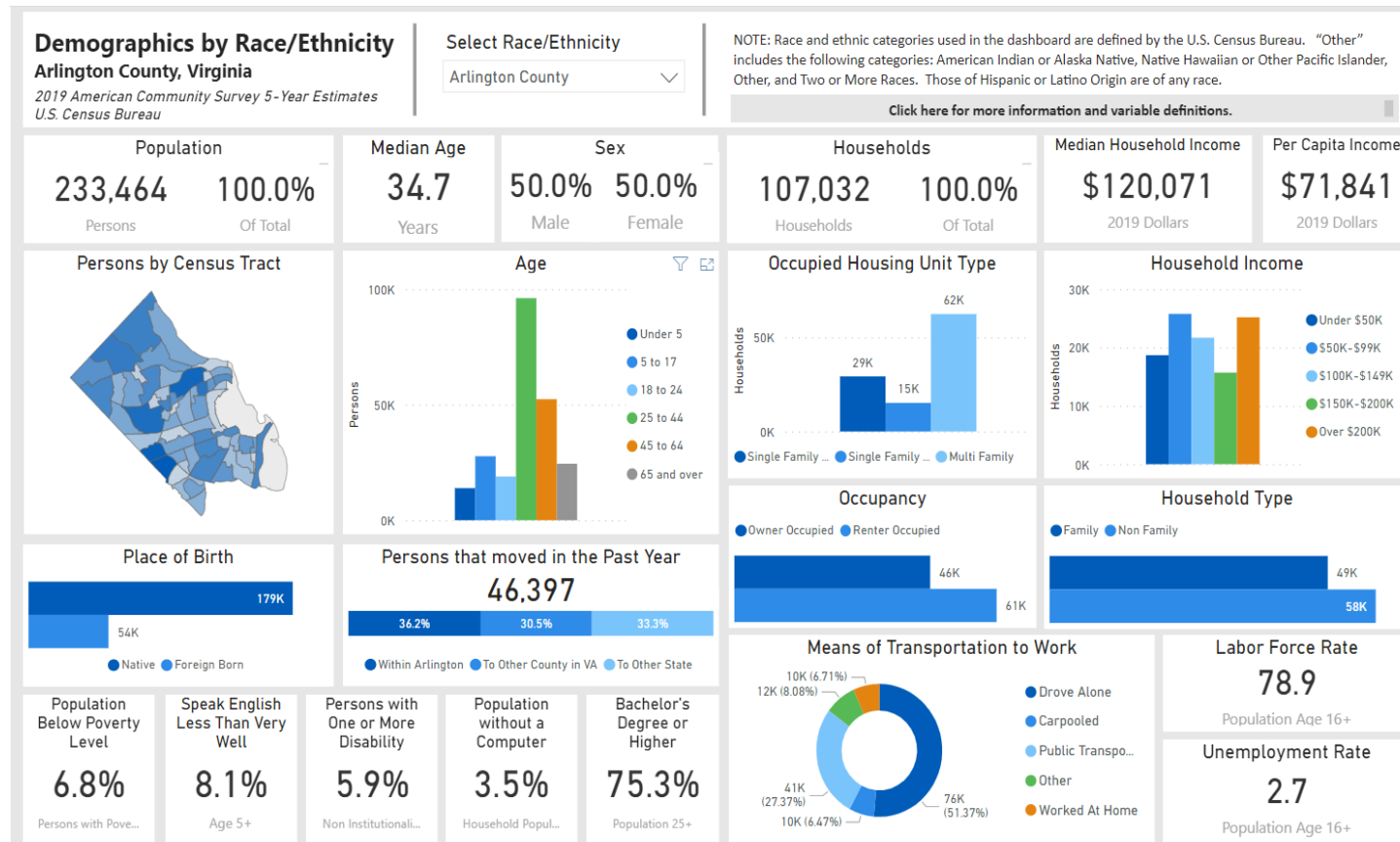

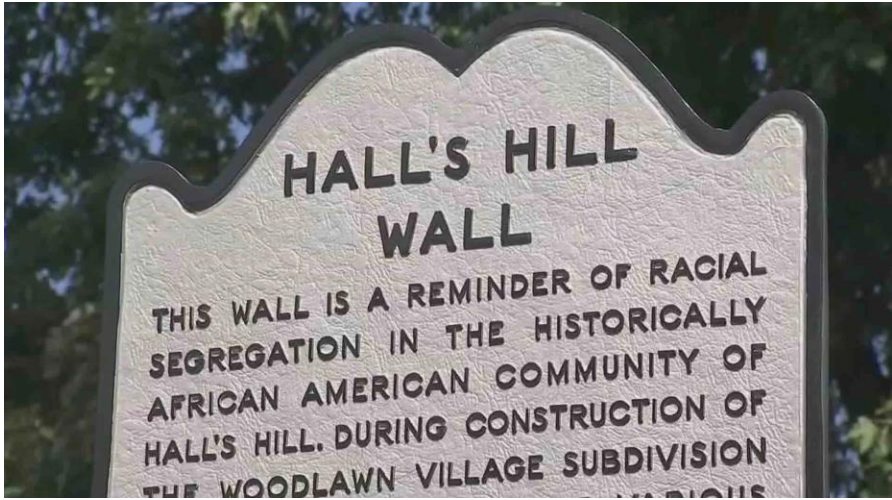

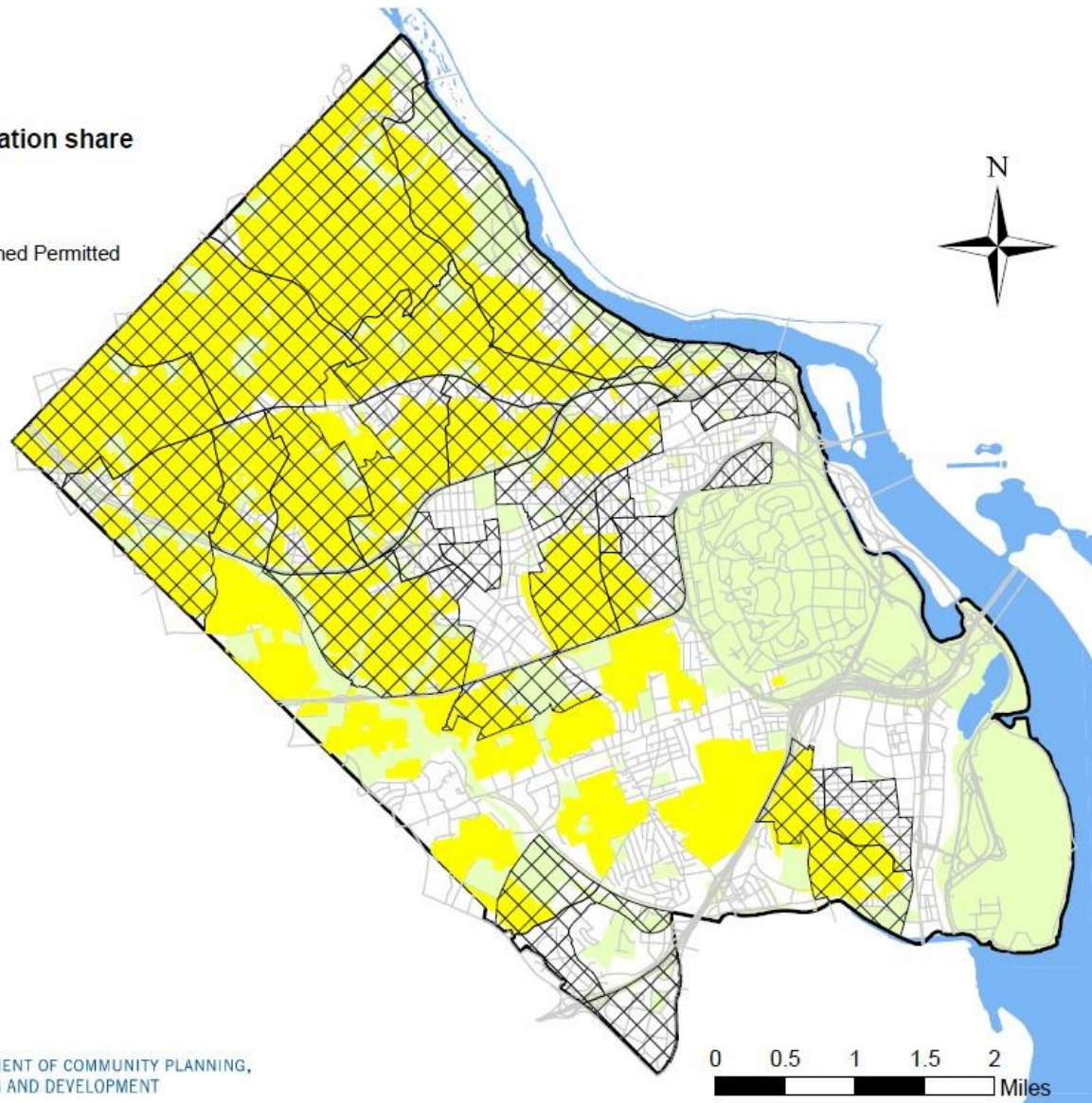

White (non latino) population share

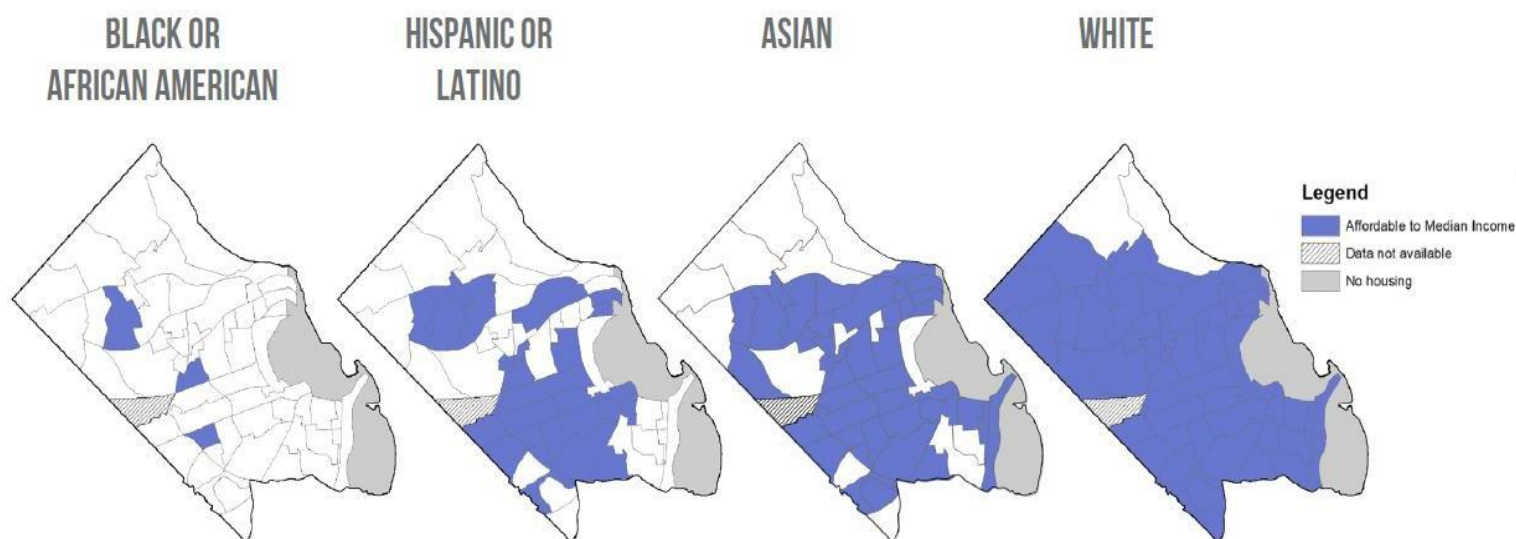
