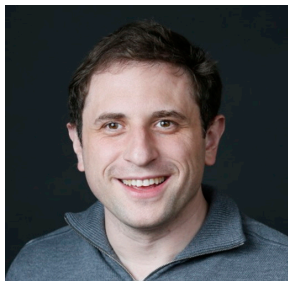

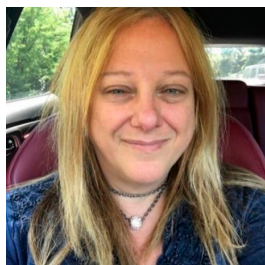

Jim Lantelme



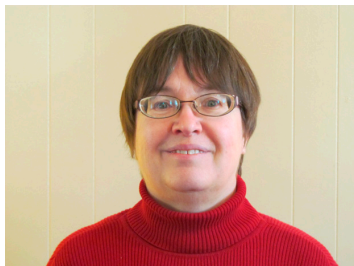

Jonathan Ware



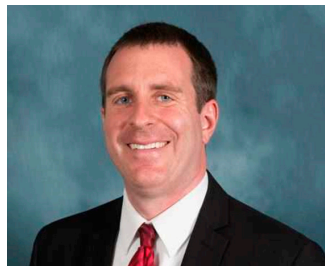
