June General Membership Meeting Outbrief

PROGRAM

ACCF was honored to welcome Arlington County government and civic leadership to discuss a range of topics including a vote on ACCF's Planning & Zoning Resolution, a vote on ACCF Officers & Directors for FY25-26, a briefing from Arlington County Police Chief Andy Penn, and several committee presentations detailing their accomplishments over the course of FY24-25. We included time for the audience to ask questions throughout, with membership involvement in the discussion a priority. Discussion topics included:

- Planning & Zoning (P&Z) Resolution second reading and vote Jack Spilsbury, Co-chair of the P&Z committee, led a second reading of the updated Resolution to Improve Planning and Zoning Policy & Processes.
 - Questions from the audience included:
 - How does the resolution recommend the County accounts for CA engagement & other stakeholders?
 - Have you considered recommending the County incorporates SPRC votes?
 - How do we ensure planning committees have a higher proportion of local residents participating?
 - How are you defining transit corridors? How do you define adequate infrastructure/capacity?
 - How can we increase accountability with the county as they're making GLUP-related decisions?
 - A motion was made to approve the P&Z Resolution To Improve Planning & Zoning Policy and Processes, which was circulated in the May and June 2025 newsletters, shared with member organizations, and updated based on ACCF Committee and member feedback. The motion was moved, and seconded. The vote to adopt the resolution was approved (58 Yea, 3 Nay, 4 Abstentions). The approved resolution can be found here.
- Arlington Historical Society presentation on Virginia 250 Plans Peter Vaselopulos, President of the Arlington Historical Society (AHS), and Sean Denniston, Vice President of AHS, shared an overview of AHS's plans for commemorating America's 250th anniversary next year. You can review AHS's presentation here. Questions included:

- Are you working with the Black Heritage Museum?
- Are you considering Native American history in your Virginia 250 planning?

• Briefing from Arlington County Police Chief Andy Penn

Chief Penn discussed crime trends in Arlington County, including an increase in shoplifting in 2024. ACPD is collaborating with the DC Police Department in support of the Army parade this weekend. Sergeant Sarah Butzer from ACPD's community engagement team previewed quarterly community events and meetings. ACDP will be hosting community conversations on August 7th and 12th focused on pedestrian traffic and school safety. ACPD is also hosting several <u>summer kids programs and camps</u> that are already fully subscribed.

Questions from the audience included:

- How are you collaborating with ICE regarding their deportation activities?
- How would you recommend we address rising graffiti in our neighborhood?
- What were the leading causes of the rise in crime across the county?
- How effective are the speed cameras installed near school zones this spring?
- ACCF Awards presentation John Ford announced winners of ACCF's 2025 community awards. Scott McCaffrey from ArlNow presented the Arlington.Now Cup award to Portia Clark. You can find all the award winners here and pictures of the event here.
- Vote on ACCF FY25-26 Officers & Directors Jean Henceroth, Nominating Committee Chair, briefed the audience on the nominating and election process. You can review these rules <u>here</u>. A vote was taken. Results below (officially validated after the meeting):

- Responses to community questions.



Virginia Hospital Center Hazel Auditorium Parking and Access Instructions for General Membership Meetings

Reminder: Parking passes will be provided. Meetings are held in the 'Conference Center' depicted on the map below.

The VHC Director of Security has advised CivFed that we should begin to park in Parking Garage C (map below). You can then walk across to the Oncology entrance and gain admittance until 8 p.m. **After the meeting, you MUST EXIT via the Women's and Infant lobby.**


ENTER (until 8 p.m.): Zone C Ground floor Oncology entrance (only open until 8 pm, Monday-Friday)

- Sign into the visitor kiosks (**need driver's license each time**)
- Get visitor sticker and wear at all times when inside the hospital
- Take a right at the double doors by the visitor kiosks
- Take a right at the single door
- Go to elevators and take to lobby floor
- Exit elevators and go left to hall directly behind welcome desk in lobby
- Take a left at the single door and continue down the hall toward a set of double doors
- Go through double doors and go right
- · Conference center auditorium is directly ahead

ENTER or EXIT (24/7): Zone C first floor Women's and Infant lobby entrance (please use this entrance to exit after 8 pm, open 24/7):

- Sign into the visitor kiosks (**need driver's license each time**)
- Get visitor sticker and wear at all times when inside the hospital
- Walk to hall directly behind the welcome desk in the lobby
- Take a left at the single door and continue down the hall toward a set of double doors
- Go through double doors and go right
- Conference center auditorium is directly ahead
