Find Your Place in History

250 Traveling Trunk and Digital History Kit

AHS will provide a "Traveling Trunk," for schools and special neighborhood events. These trunks will contain reproductions of artifacts and documents from the Revolutionary War era and other periods, providing a tangible connection to the past. AHS will also provide a digital history kit that will help with July 4th commemoration activities.





We The People

In early 2026, AHS will host a temporary exhibit on its second floor, “We the People.” This exhibition will explore the many people who, over centuries, have made Virginia, the unique place it is in America and in the world, and the dramatic impact of the immigrant experience throughout Virginia’s history as people arrived from the four corners of the globe.

Local historians and educators can submit story ideas, including the people, places, and events that have had a significant historical impact on Arlington and the country. 250 by 2026 will be accessible on both a website, an app, as well as a planned commemorative newspaper.
