President's Message

I hope each of you enjoyed a wonderful Thanksgiving surrounded by family, friends, and the traditions that make this season so special. As we turn toward the close of the year, I am reminded of how fortunate we are to live in a community that values both fellowship and civic engagement.

Urgent Action Item. The County Board is considering an **Advisory Panel to Examine Arlington County's Form of Government** and it will be discussed at the December County Board meeting. In the interim, there is a <u>survey</u> that closes on Monday, December 1 at noon. Let your voice be heard through this survey, Open Door Mondays, or other communication with the County Board. **Dave Schutz**, will give us an update on the initiative at our December General Meeting and there is an article in this newsletter.

Adaptive Reuse Applications. I'm pleased to share that we've seen encouraging progress in how adaptive reuse applications are being processed. In the most recent case of 1800/1901 S Bell Street, the County hosted an open meeting for the community, the developer provided a clear and thorough presentation, and a member of the Planning Commission joined the discussion. This level of collaboration is exactly what we have been advocating for, and it represents a step forward in ensuring that residents are informed and engaged without delaying the streamlined process. The project is scheduled to go before the Board for approval in December, and we will continue to follow the process.

Comprehensive Plan. The County is compiling the many comments over the last round of engagement. Your participation is critical on this foundational document that will guide the future of the County, and we look forward to a revised draft over the winter.

November Meeting. Our session on demystifying the development process gave lots of insights into the various players and decisions in development. Thanks to moderator Brian Harner and our experts Marc McCauley, Kedrick Whitmore, Casey Nolan, and Mary-Claire Burick. This is the start of improved collaboration, and the problem-solving approach promoted in the recently adopted Planning & Zoning resolution. December Meeting. This month's program promises to be especially engaging. We are honored to welcome **Arlington County Manager Mark Schwartz**, who

will be answering questions and sharing insights on the issues that lie ahead in 2026, particularly the budget and comprehensive plan update. His perspective will be invaluable as we prepare for the challenges and opportunities of the coming year. We were pleased to cohost a roundtable with the County Manager and civic/condo association presidents in November. It was a wide-ranging discussion of issues across the County.

Duke Banks will also be with us to discuss the Arlington Historical Society's plans for <u>Virginia 250</u>, a commemoration that will connect our local history to the broader story of the Commonwealth and the nation.

As we enter the final weeks of 2025, I encourage each of you to stay engaged, ask questions, and make your voice heard. CivFed thrives on the dedication and curiosity of its members, and together we continue shaping Arlington's future. To support this work, CivFed hosts the **Arlington Neighborhood News Exchange** (**ANNE**), a resource that allows neighborhood newsletter editors and webmasters to share and swap articles. Arlington County just announced the FY 2027 Opportunities Grant. This grant is intended to support nonprofits in implementing programs or projects which will create opportunities for Arlington residents to thrive, while reducing, eliminating, and preventing inequities in direct response to demonstrated community or human service needs. Proposals are due January 13, 2026.

The County anticipates allocating \$1.25 million for FY 2027 in support of this grant cycle. More information on the program, including a link to the application portal, may be found here.

Arlington VA250 Commemorative Events/Programs/Activities

The Arlington County Board has designated the Arlington Historical Society (AHS) to chair Arlington's VA250 Committee to coordinate the planning of county-wide efforts to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution. Five projects, collectively titled "Arlington VA250", have been proposed. These include:



Find Your Place in History

Find Your Place in History (FYPH) is a marketing campaign that will allow local neighborhoods, historic locations, and business districts to participate in 2026 commemorative celebrations. The program will promote Arlington's history by utilizing decorative flags and storefront images. These flags and images will present historic themes tailored to each of the participating "places." FYPH will also create an online map showing the locations of the flags and where neighborhoods will hold their July 4th events.

The second project, "250 by 2026," will be an opportunity for local historians and educators to research and submit their top 250 story ideas online, including the people, places, and events that have had a significant historical impact on Arlington and the country. 250 by 2026 will be accessible on both a website and an app, as well as a planned commemorative newspaper.

The third project, "HistoryFest 250," will be a history festival scheduled for May

9, 2026, at Kenmore Middle School. It will feature dozens of outdoor exhibits highlighting Arlington's collective history. The event will include living history demonstrations, live music, food vendors, and presentations sponsored by civic, neighborhood, and historical organizations.

We the People Exhibit

Starting in early 2026, AHS will host a temporary exhibit titled "We the People" on the second floor of the AHS museum in the Historic Hume School on Arlington Ridge Road. "This exhibition will explore the many people who, over centuries, have made Virginia, the unique place it is in America and in the world, and the dramatic impact of the immigrant experience throughout Virginia's history as people arrived from the four corners of the globe.



250 Traveling Trunk

In honor of America's 250th anniversary in 2026, AHS will offer local schools a "History Traveling Trunk," a portable, hands-on educational kit for classrooms and events. These trunks contain reproductions of artifacts and documents from the Revolutionary War era and other periods, providing students with a tangible connection to the past.

Virginia Hospital Center Hazel Auditorium Parking and Access Instructions for General Membership Meetings

Reminder: Parking passes will be provided. Meetings are held in the 'Conference Center' depicted on the map below.

The VHC Director of Security has advised CivFed that we should begin to park in Parking Garage C (map below). You can then walk across to the Oncology entrance and gain admittance until 8 p.m. **After the meeting, you MUST EXIT via the Women's and Infant lobby.**

ENTER (until 8 p.m.): Zone C Ground floor Oncology entrance (only open until 8 pm, Monday-Friday)

- Sign into the visitor kiosks (need driver's license each time)
- Get visitor sticker and wear at all times when inside the hospital
- Take a right at the double doors by the visitor kiosks
- Take a right at the single door
- Go to elevators and take to lobby floor
- Exit elevators and go left to hall directly behind welcome desk in lobby
- Take a left at the single door and continue down the hall toward a set of double doors
- Go through double doors and go right
- Conference center auditorium is directly ahead

ENTER or EXIT (24/7): Zone C first floor Women's and Infant lobby entrance (please use this entrance to exit after 8 pm, open 24/7):

- Sign into the visitor kiosks (need driver's license each time)
- Get visitor sticker and wear at all times when inside the hospital
- Walk to hall directly behind the welcome desk in the lobby
- Take a left at the single door and continue down the hall toward a set of double doors
- Go through double doors and go right
- · Conference center auditorium is directly ahead


