## **Meeting Program**

#### Disaster Preparedness Program

At the November meeting, Jackie Snelling will moderate a program on disaster preparedness. Topic areas will include mitigation actions that can/should be taken in advance, emergency communications (personal phone, cell and internet, 911, and public alerts and warnings), home continuity including water, food (refrigeration, cooking), lighting, medical, heating and cooling (generators?). In addition to the specific areas for individual preparedness, we would like to focus on expectations for what can/cannot be addressed and potential roles for neighborhoods, civic associations and other civic organizations.

The presenters will be:

- Deborah Tompkins Johnson Manager-Regional State and Local Affairs, Dominion
- Tony Savage, Operations Manager, Dominion
- Doug Brammer, Manager of Government Affairs at Verizon

Each guest will have 15 minutes to present followed by about 15 minutes of planned questions for the panel. At the conclusion of the remarks from the panel presenters and prepared questions, there will be 30 minutes of delegate. The program will be 90 minutes in length.
