In keeping with our Standing Rules that limit a delegate to speaking no more than "three minutes consecutively," the Executive Committee agreed at its December meeting that a **delegate may ask a follow-up question** if desired, as long as the total time for both the original and the follow-up question does not exceed the three-minute allowance.

### School Board Speaks to Delegates (continued)

An array of interesting topics were discussed during the evening including the ongoing challenges and opportunities of the English as a Second Language program in the schools. Currently, for 6,700 students in the Arlington system (out of a total student population of 17,500), English is not their first language. Because of the diversity of this population, an array of approaches is required, delegates were told.

Another challenge currently facing the Arlington schools is preparing for Virginia's new "Standards of Learning" which are requiring extensive curriculum revisions and additional changes throughout the system in order to meet new student testing and state assessment requirements.

Additional topics covered by School Board members included the Capital Improvement Program; current use of school buildings; increased role of technology in the education of students; and ways that civic groups can assist.

# **Delegates Hear About Crime Trends**

Also at the December meeting, Daniel Boring, Deputy Chief of Police, and members of the County's Crime Analysis Unit gave an informative presentation on criminal activity in Arlington.

The Police officers provided a helpful handout to delegates that listed the County's 10 "beats" and the names and telephone numbers of each of the Corporal Liaisons assigned to those beats.

Delegates were told that there are currently six known gangs in Arlington -- 4 Hispanic, 1 Black; and 1 Asian. So far, the gangs have proven to be more of a threat to

each other than to the community at large. Graffiti, often gang-related, is a community problem, however, and residents are requested to call the Graffiti Hotline (358-4264) when they spot graffiti. Cleanup on public property is done as quickly as possible.
